"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me." Galatians 2:20 is one of my favorite verses written by the Apostle Paul to the Galatians. The students know that Paul is my go-to example for living a life that is on fire for Christ, counting all the costs and living "all-in," sharing and living out the Gospel. The teachings of Paul also frustrate me, because he doesn't always spell everything out with direct clear answers; he makes us think for ourselves and "work things out." Paul calls us to lean into the confidence that we have been given by the Spirit as he tells us in 2 Corinthians 3:6, that our competence comes from God, not from ourselves, which takes me back to why I love Galatians 2:20, because I have experienced God's faithfulness as I have learned to get out of my way and allow Christ to have His way in my life.

Eight years ago when I stepped into the Student Center to observe the youth group for the first time and see what it was all about, I would have never imagined where it would lead! In October of 2018, I humbly accepted the call to be the Director of Student Ministries and fully relied on God to equip me for what He was calling me to, and God proved faithful.



Retirement and Musical Chairs

As you think back to the game of musical chairs, you may remember the thrill of landing in one of



the remaining seats or the agony of being cast out. There's a significant difference between the two feelings, of course. That's why it's important for people making the retirement transition to ensure they have replacement chairs waiting for them.

It may be time to try some new chairs. Think about the variables of the workplace which slowly disappear in retirement. Work provides purpose and identity, social interaction and physical activity, not to mention timelines, goals and a sense of routine. When you leave full-time work, retirement upends everything.

Some of the familiar chairs may seem to have either been moved or eliminated. Your life is no longer defined by your role at work...your social interactions might decrease in frequency and value... physical activity may not come as easy or often... and you have to develop both a new routine and new goals.

But if you have a new set of chairs in place, life can be fantastic. Here's how to do it, using three musical motifs:

Measure & Scale: Take an inventory of the top five or 10 things that work provides for you. Do you enjoy certain tasks, co-workers or types of projects? Think about the various roles you have had as well as strengths described in your annual reviews or spiritual gifts. Consider writing these things down. That way, you can better see what work gives you, and then, strategize ways to replace them. Too often, people assume some of these things will automatically fall into place. They won't. Be proactive.

Ensemble: Try to do things in a group format. Take an exercise class, group travel or volunteer with friends. Make the event social and you can enhance the feel-

ing derived from the activity. Or consider applying your personal strengths to *new* areas of interest you can do with others. If you are handy, consider volunteering to help a community theater company or church VBS with its set design and props.

Skip To A New Beat: Work may have held you back in some areas of life. So, it may be time to try some new chairs. Launch a new business, start a hobby, host a new group at your home. It's not uncommon for people entering retirement to want to be part of something bigger than themselves and to have a lasting impact on others. To do so, take some time to <u>consider your legacy</u> and the ways you feel drawn, or compelled, to help others.

In short, rather than feeling cast out in retirement, keep the music playing. Maybe even up the tempo by replacing the things you valued at work with wholly new ones in this new transition. 

LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

With his arrival we were invited to spend several days in Iowa, and I therefore missed both a Special Leadership Team meeting and the regularly scheduled LT meeting, but I report takeaways as follows.

As a result of the special LT meeting in April (that I called and then missed!), I am very pleased to report that Elizabeth "Lizy" Johnson began as Countryside's Director of Student Ministries on April 15. This allows overlap before Kelly leaves; I appreciate their shared goal of continuity for our youth. I wish to thank the seven search committee members for their faithful work in the recommendation. They are Tom Sullivan (Chair), Aaron Glendening, Jen Scheck, Sarah Boese, Megan Pruitt, Ronald Hamilton and Steve Eilrich. As a reminder, bringing in new staff at CCC is by 2/3 Leadership Team vote, but a call for a pastoral position would be by 2/3 congregational vote. Lizy, we welcome you and pray God's blessings upon your service here.

I report also that I understand Covenant Properties spent a day with staff, and made a presentation at the April LT meeting. I am sure a focus was on options regarding space for Christian Formation classes. Properties Team was invited to the LT meeting. Like you, I look forward to hearing or learning more.

We as LT (and staff) penned a vision last year augmenting our mission statement, and I repeat this from last month's PULSE "We exist to make and deepen disciples who make Jesus their top priority, obey his commands, and teach others to do the same." Have I mentioned I am a new grandpa? I expected something special, but still, when I walked in that Monday mid morning and saw little Miles I teared up at the miracle of new life that God had blessed Laura and Andrew and our family with. I realized this is how our Lord Jesus looks at all men. As the Spirit moves in our hearts and matures us as followers of Jesus, this is the nature we take on. We as LT discern a "holy tug," as found in the Great Commission, that we seek not just to learn about Jesus but to be like Jesus and intentionally share this life with others by discipling. In Acts there are several references to "the Way." Acts 24:14 and part of 15: "But this I confess to you, that according to the Way, which they call a sect, I worship the God of our fathers, believing everything laid down by the Law and written in the Prophets, having a hope in God." This of course references the church, the followers of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of their lives. But the intensity and reality of Jesus' life in the gospels, of Jesus' desire to share God's love and redemptive plan to the world; this discipling or this sharing of this "Way" of life, is something we desire for our church. Discipleship has been described to me by Bob Wil-

liford of our LT as "a very rigorous process of teaching and training and was primarily motivated by the disciple wanting to be like the rabbi." We want to enable the deep desire of wanting to be like Jesus in our day to day circumstances both by being discipled by others and by discipling others in our church. There isn't a program we can adopt, rather it is a way of life. Nonetheless, as described before, LT and staff have identified three activities throughout the year of Trunk or Treat, Christmas program and the upcoming VBS program wherein we seek a springboard toward discipling by approaching these as intergenerational, "all church" occasions. We have already heard good testimony from this focus! Please consider how you may participate in our June VBS this year. You may contact Amy Brunk, and/or stay tuned for possible ways to serve in this all church effort for VBS. I desire that my grandson grow up knowing and serving Jesus with living examples of what this looks like around him, and we desire this for our church as well. Bob has also said that being a disciple "means emulating Jesus in our time, culture, political landscape, etc...how do we learn to be like Jesus and how do we demonstrate being like Jesus in our day-to-day circumstances?" Again, please consider how you can participate in VBS this year, how you are being discipled, and how you can disciple others.
