The Power of the Tongue

Isaiah begins his Prophetic book in this way:

Isaiah 1:4 - Woe to the sinful nation, a people whose guilt is great, a brood of evildoers, children given to corruption!

Isaiah continues to pronounce these "woes" upon God's obstinate, hardheaded and disobedient people for the first five chapters. He does so in obedience to God's calling upon his life. Isaiah is really good at what he does.

But something life-changing happens within Isaiah in chapter 6. He suddenly turns the *"woes*" upon himself.

6:5 - "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty."

Why the change? Because Isaiah was caught up into the presence of the Lord.

6:1 - In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple.

The more we spend time in the presence of our Lord, the less critical and judgmental we will be of others because we will recognize how far we too have fallen short. We will begin to see others as God sees them; with eyes of compassion...worthy enough to die for.

Did you notice how Isaiah's repentance was directed toward his very strength, gifting and profession as a prophet of God? *"Woe to me...I am a man of unclean lips."*

During these days of corruption, division and dissention, we as Christ-followers are

called to demonstrate the love of Christ in our works **and** words. Yes, we are to speak the truth without compromise, but we are to do so **in love**. (Eph 4:15).

The Apostle Peter said it this way:

Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander. 1 Peter 3:15.

Peter learned this by watching the example of Jesus for three years.

When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. **1 Peter 2:23**

During the course of conversations, I have at times won the argument but lost the relationship, because of my lousy attitude and lack of love. As Christ-followers we can "*win the battle but lose the war*."

The Bible has much to say about the tongue. It can be used as an instrument of destruction or an instrument of blessing.

It is my prayer that we will use our lips to bless others, encourage and build up, not tear down. And when we are occasionally called to confront and admonish someone, I pray that we will always do so in love, conveying an attitude of gentleness and respect in obedience to scripture.

Ministry to Women

One of my recent devotions centered on Luke 8:18. It reads, "So pay attention to how you hear. To those who listen to my teaching, more understanding will be given. But for those who are not listening, even what they think they understand will be taken away from them." Have you ever thought about God's wisdom as being given to you or taken from you? Jesus is pretty clear here – for those who will listen, more truth and wisdom will be given. But to those who do not listen and follow, truths will be concealed. We may not fully understand why God does this, but we should heed the warning to follow the wisdom God gives us and treat it more precious than diamonds. God will give His truth and wisdom to those who seek, ask, and follow. But to those who listen but ignore it, they will live in confusion, unclarity, and a cycle of discontentment. So then we should ask the question, "How much do you crave and desire God's wisdom?" Ask God to grow His wisdom in you. Where and how do I grow His wisdom?

- 1) Study the scriptures to gain wisdom
- 2) Spend time in prayer to grow in wisdom
- 3) Read Christ-centered devotions and books to gain wisdom
- 4) Seek out Godly counsel for biblical wisdom

LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

Greetings Church – What does it mean to live in community?

The early believers in Asia Minor found themselves in a very difficult situation. By becoming followers of Christ, they were adopting a world view that was counter cultural to the world in which they lived. Their culture, much like ours today, ascribed value to people based on wealth, beauty, accomplishments, and political/social status. It also pushed for individualism and self-sufficiency. The Christ-centered values of their newfound belief which focuses on servant leadership and caring for and supporting one another in community was vastly different than what the world told them. However, they flourished amidst hardship because of these Christ-centered values. They were there for each other, sharing in hardships, caring for each other in times of need and celebrating with each other in times of joy. The social and economic walls of their culture were broken down and they were living in community.

As we look at our current world, we see a lot of similarities in what our culture values – most especially the concept of individualism and self-sufficiency. This creates a cultural hurdle for our ability to live in community and has been exacerbated by the isolation we have all seen and experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic. Although we have been able to leverage modern technology to stay connected, that same technology could also allow us to exercise more individualism and self-sufficiency by connecting "virtually" and in a sense work against our ability to be there for each other.

As we are beginning to see some relaxation of the social distancing guidelines and are moving toward meeting "in-person" more fully, I would encourage all of us to remember what it means to live in community. Let us not allow the convenience of the technology we have so nicely leveraged to keep us connected, now hinder us from meeting together and fully exercising our spirit of community.

> Hebrews 10:24-25 - And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Let us hold firm to the examples that Jesus gave us for putting the needs of others ahead of what is easy or convenient for us as individuals. God does not call us to live as self-sufficient, but to be wholly dependent upon Him, loving and caring for one another. The world is watching us. May they see Jesus in how we respond to everything that comes our way.
