Thankful Hearts or Grumbling Hearts -Pastor Jon Black

November 24th will soon be here and many of us will be gathering around tables to celebrate Thanksgiving with our loved ones. In my household some of our annual Thanksgiving traditions include carving up the turkey, enjoying a great meal, and expressing reasons for which are thankful. It is truly a special time of year.

But there is also one other annual tradition! It is the time once again that I have to drag out those blasted Christmas decorations and hang up the outside lights. And can anybody please remind me why so many bulbs are burned out on those lights?

It is about this time every year that the Spirit of God reminds me to:

> Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. - 1 Thess 5:16-18

Ugh!

Displaying hearts of gratitude can be challenging as we encounter life's difficulties and frustrations. But God commands us to give thanks in all circumstances regardless. And if God com-



mands this of us, we can know that he will also transform our hearts when we choose to obey.

I recently read a story about how quickly we can give into our sinful nature and resort to grumbling over giving thanks.

> Back in 1988, a Polish railway worker named Jan Grzebski was hit by a train. He lived ... but only barely. For the next 19 years Grzebski was in a coma.

He awoke in 2007 to a whole new world. Nineteen years earlier, Poland was a communist state. Grzebski noted; "Back then meat was rationed and there were huge lines at nearly every gas station. And there used to be only tea and vinegar in the shops."

But 19 years later, he awoke to a free nation where he said: "There are so many people on the streets with cell phones and so many goods in the shops that it makes my head spin."

But something else puzzled him. "What amazes me is all the people who walk around with their cell phones and yet they never stop complaining about things."

These people had freedom, food, and wealth greater than Poland had had for decades ... and yet Grzebski woke from his coma to find that all they seemed to want to do was grumble!

If we don't get into the habit of thanking God for what we DO have, we will soon become ungrateful because of what we DON'T have.

God reminds us of what life will look like in the last days:

People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, **ungrateful**, unholy. - 2 Tim 3:2

But those who love God will be known by their hearts overflowing with gratitudeand not just during the Thanksgiving meal until they have to drag out the Christmas lights.

How are we spending what time we have here on earth? What does God think about how we spend our time? Certainly our time is in God's hands!

The older we get, the more precious time becomes. We realize we may have precious little left compared to the first half of our lives. How would God have us fill our remaining time?

A look at Jesus's last three years of His life points us toward the answer.

Reading through the gospels we see that Jesus went from town to town, declaring that "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!" Then he healed the sick, cast out demons, raised the dead, and shared the Good News of the Gospel with everyone who would listen. As His story unfolds, we become keenly aware of how Jesus lives His life in the service of others. From sun up to long after it's gone down, he exhausts each day on behalf of those who need Him. And He trained His disciples to do the same. This is His Father's mission for Him and Jesus's distinct calling to us as His disciples.

Do I reach the end of each day feeling "spent" in service to others? Have I done the good that my good God has asked me to do? Do I bear the image of Christ to my fellow employees, neighbors, and family members by serving them? Jesus said that for me to have true life, I have to give mine away as He did. To hoard it, save it up, fritter it, or "manage" it, often makes me unavailable to pursue God's calling on my life. One glance at my calendar will show my priorities.

Who will you serve today? "For you are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that you should walk in them." (Eph. 2:10) Start by serving with Crescendo this month!

They propelled onto the Christian music scene in 2011 as the first ever ROCK THE CAMP contest winners hosted by TobyMac and Camp Electric. Soon after receiving this prestigious honor, Cloverton scored the #1 most downloaded song in the history of KLOVE radio for their first single "Take Me into the Beautiful," which also charted at #12 on the overall Christian Billboard top 25. They followed up that effort with an unforgettable Christmas rendition of Leonard Cohen's song "Hallelujah," reaching millions of viewers on YouTube in just weeks while climbing to the #1 slot on iTunes.

Cloverton continues to pave a new way for independent Christian music, and we are so excited to have them back!

Leadership Team


Last month I expressed thankfulness that Christian Formation classes had begun. I am equally thankful that life groups have resumed. These "subsets" of our congregation invite fellowship, time to share and grow together, and give us one mechanism for encouragement and accountability among the greater fellowship that is Countryside. I believe our life groups are one of many ways we can "grow in the grace and the truth of Jesus Christ as we worship, disciple, serve and multiply."

This month Leadership Team allocated some of our Faith Funds. We gave generously to the following ministries: the radio station KJIL, the McPherson Thanksgiving Community dinner, and the cost of the Cloverton Concert planned for November 30 at Countryside (free admission). It is a privilege to have these Faith Funds to use to bless ministry and missions beyond budget line items – thank you for your generosity.

Our Adult Ministries Director has formally been a part -time position, but responsibilities have been updated and the position is now a full-time position for Pastor Lynn Black. This may not look too different from last month or last year – we had temporarily increased the hours for this position during Pastor Jeremy's deployment, subsequently hours were similarly extended during Pastor Jon's sabbatical, and finally due to additional responsibilities that had been added, this position had continued until now with authorized extended hours. So this "change" to full-time is an outcome of our discerned church needs.

The Harvest Festival, which includes our annual Special Meeting for presentation and approval of the budget, is November 20. After the celebratory noon meal, please plan to stay for this all-church meeting wherein we will have time to reflect, share and give God thanks both for his goodness this past year and also for his love for us – love so great that he sent his only Son Jesus Christ into the world as our Savior. While weather, politics, and many worldly concerns may press in on us, we focus on obedience to God, and we can rest in peace knowing God is in control and God is good.
