The Same God Yesterday, Today and Forever – Pastor Jon Black

I am currently reading through the Bible using the Bible Gateway app. In it, I receive three daily Old Testament chapters and one New Testament chapter each morning.

Recently, I have been struck by the seeming contrast between Old Covenant and New Covenant. It can appear that the God found in the Old Testament chapters is a God full of judgment and anger, while the God of the New Testament is much more patient, loving, and gracious. But we have been taught that our God is unchanging, the same yesterday, today and forever.

So how can we reconcile judgments we read about in the Old Testament with Jesus' promise of grace and forgiveness in the New? This is a common question especially for those who are struggling through difficult life circumstances, be they physical, relational, emotional, or spiritual.

Someone might ask: "Is my pain a result of God's judgment on my sin?"

During this Easter season we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus promising complete forgiveness and a brand-new life in Him. We are reminded that "there is now no condemnation for those who are in



Christ Jesus." But is this promise only applicable to those who don't mess up too badly?

I was getting more and more discouraged reading through the Old Testament Law highlighting its blessings for the obedient and curses for the disobedient.

Deut 28:15 - If you do not obey the Lord your God and do not carefully follow all his commands and decrees I am giving you today, all these curses will come on you and overtake you... (I will let you enjoy reading through all of the specific curses found in the rest of the chapter.)

How have I disobeyed? Oh, let me count the ways. Consider the Ten Commandments:

#2 - Who doesn't struggle with placing other things or people above God? (idolatry)

#4 - Who is not guilty of neglecting to set aside a day of dedicated worship and rest? (sabbath)

#6 - Who doesn't harbor bitterness and unforgiveness in their hearts toward others? (murder)

7 - Who doesn't occasionally entertain lustful thoughts in their heart? (adultery)

#10 - Who doesn't occasionally become jealous of another's success and prosperity? (covet)

I, like the Israelites before me, am guilty as charged, thousands of times over. Is that why I am struggling so much? Satan, the Accuser of the believers would lead me to believe this lie and would love to watch me collapse into shame and guilt.

But then in my daily reading, I came to Deuteronomy 30 which focuses on the heart of repentance. It highlights the person who recognizes his or her guilt and turns back to the Lord for forgiveness. And this is God's response to such a heart.

Deut 30:2... and when you and your children return to the Lord your God and obey him with all your heart and with all your soul according to everything I command you today, 3 then the Lord your God will restore your fortunes and have compassion on you and gather you again from all the nations where he scattered you.

Throughout the Old Testament, we read descriptions of the patient and longsuffering heart of God toward His disobedient people even as we see in the New Testament. This merciful God is One...

...who does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. - Ps 108:10-12.








Connecting women to each other and to Jesus!

The Cross: Hope and Redemption

• At the heart of the logo, a cross within a window symbolizes Christ's sacrifice, offering hope and redemption. It reflects our mission to serve with love and compassion, just as Christ calls us to help those in need.

"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." – Luke 19:10

The Red Roof: Shelter and Protection

• The red roof represents the blood of Christ, symbolizing sacrifice, protection, and a place of refuge. It aligns with our mission to provide secure housing, ensuring that everyone feels safe and valued.

"But you, Lord, are a shield around me, my glory, the One who lifts my head high." – Psalm 3:3

The House: A Haven of Hospitality

• The house signifies stability and belonging, reflecting biblical teachings of welcoming the stranger. It serves as a reminder of our duty to support those facing housing challenges.

We are also gauging the need of our missionaries in their additional financial help as well.
