# Faith, Hope and Love

The Apostle Paul offers a great description of love in 1 Corinthians 13. The chapter ends in the following way:

13 And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

What are the differences between faith, hope and love? I find myself using these words interchangeably at times when referring to my spiritual walk. But how do they differ? And how is love the greatest of the three?

We demonstrate faith in something when we trust in an invisible reality. For example: we hop on a 747 jet without understanding in the least how this metal object could possibly hold and transport 400 passengers to far away destinations traveling at 570 MPH. But we have faith that the plane is able to do so. So, we buckle in and enjoy the ride.

Hope would be the process of waiting for that invisible reality to become visible. We hope for that future reality to be realized, namely the landing of the plane on the runway of our vacation destination....or at the place where our loved ones are awaiting our safe arrival. Those thoughts fill us with joy and strength.

Love is the goal and outward expression of our faith and hope. When we finally land, we will embrace those awaiting us as an expression of our love for them.

Love is the greatest of the three because as Paul says in the opening three verses of 1 Corinthians 13..... Without love, I am nothing... and I gain nothing. Love is

the goal and expression of our faith and hope.

I read an example illustrating this point.



There was a woman that felt called to teach in a one room Christian-based schoolhouse. She left her old life behind and dedicated her time and energy to the instruction and care of her new class of children. However....after she arrived and began teaching, the children experienced fear and intimidation in her presence. She wore a frown and exuded no joy in her interactions with the children....even as she remained 100% dedicated in her commitment to teaching them.

As Christ-followers, sometimes our zeal of dedication and commitment can replace the love of God in and through our lives. Exercising our gifts and commitments by faith will ultimately amount to nothing, without possessing the love of Christ in our hearts according to the Apostle Paul.

All three are essential in our Christian walk.

13 And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

But the ultimate goal of our faith and hope in Christ is love expressed in the now and for all eternity.

How do others experience the tangible expressions of the love of Christ in and through our lives as we live by faith and with hope?



The recent stories from those coming into the cottages have been heartbreaking. One team member shared, "I have worked in

this field for ten years and have never witnessed so much heartache. I don't know how to handle this much trauma." In just one week, we encountered a young woman who had been trafficked, a young man who was so deeply saddened that he was on the verge of suicide, and another family living in a rental home with sewage pooling under the house, which was making them ill. "Where is God in all of this?" she cried out.

A few days later, she walked into the office with a cheerful grin. We asked her what had changed. "Remember when I told you about my difficult week and all the heartbreaking stories?" she asked. "Yes," we replied. "Well, God showed up for me today," she explained. "At the cottages, two young mothers sat on the porch while their kids played in the grass. The sad young man has found hope through the support of a Christian counselor, and the family has found a new home where the kids and their grandmother can live in a healthy environment. I can finally see God's healing hand in all of this. Although they still have a long way to go, they have finally found peace, and they feel safe and loved for the first time."

This is just a sampling of the recent stories that continue to unfold. They remind us why we do this work and motivate us to move forward with our mission. When facing difficulties, we rely on God to help us find a way ahead. As we approach Thanksgiving, we feel especially grateful for the blessings we have received through our faith community and for God's continued blessings in our lives and in the lives of those we serve.

### Happy Thanksgiving!

Last month I reported that classroom painting was complete and some carpet replacement was yet to happen. The new carpet installation is now completed! Also of note, **Our fall Harvest Festival meal and all church business meeting will be held Sunday, December 8;** this is a couple weeks later than normal primarily to avoid conflict with various other calendar items including school holiday vacation – I hope this works for you!

# Bible, constitution, bylaws, policies, employee handbook

Our permanent resource for governance is the Bible. Always seeking to abide by scripture, our church constitution and bylaws establish our Leadership Team (LT)/ Ministry Team system which I overviewed in last month's article. Each ministry team has broad discretion to achieve the goals of each particular ministry. We then have perhaps a dozen church policies approved by the LT, and last year I shared with you that LT had also approved a Personnel Policy Handbook. Generally these exist beneath the surface. The intent isn't to constrain staff or our work, rather the idea is to provide clarity and thus general freedom for routine execution of the work of Countryside. While the church constitution, bylaws, policies, etc. are meant to be useful and prudent, our prayer is that we abide in Christ, and that the Spirit be among us and teach us to be one in the Spirit as we worship and serve God in our community and in the world, and disciple, serve others and multiply.

At the December 8 business meeting we will have a ballot vote regarding the bylaw amendment that was presented at the January business meeting. I offer this overview: this proposal makes no change for calling the Senior Pastor. For calling other pastors it expedites the procedure by avoiding two meetings, 1) a nominating committee meeting to select a slate for pastoral search committee and 2) a church meeting to vote in a pastoral search committee. This is done by, for an internal candidate only, having the nominating committee serve as the pastoral search committee. The proposed amendment preserves that the search committee shall work with the conference, it preserves that the candidate must be a member of Covenant Ministerium in good standing, and it preserves that the congregation makes the call by ballot vote of 2/3. This amendment is recommended by the LT. Please see the church office if you would like a copy of the proposed amendment.

Weddings –I share that Amy and I were blessed to go to my nephew's wedding in KC mid October. The morning of the wedding I went to the Community Covenant service in Lenexa - and was surprised by Micah Black welcoming me! It was great to see him, and I was blessed worshipping at the church that my parents belonged to (my mother now attends service at her retirement village up the street). As I write this we're about to leave for San Francisco. We're invited to our son-in-law's twin brother's wedding (this is Uncle Jonathan to our grandson, Miles - and Miles will also be there!) It is a privilege and it is very encouraging to me to get invited to these weddings, in both cases centered around Christ Jesus as Lord. Jesus calls for us to abide in Him - abiding is a continuous thing, this applies for these couples in their marriage and for each of us in our church. We cannot bear fruit without abiding in Jesus, we can't abide without walking – let us pray that we will walk in the Spirit and abide in Jesus. We can pray each day "Lord Jesus, I give you this day."
