## Immersing Ourselves in God's Word - Pastor Jon Black

The average born again Christian spends more time watching TV in one evening than Bible reading in a week. (The Foster Letter)

#### William Baker suggests:

"Reading your Bible is like brushing your teeth. Everyone except you can tell that you haven't been doing it."

Immersion in the Word of God is necessary for a dynamic spiritual life. King David wrote: "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:11). Without regular time in the Word, sin creeps in without our noticing and before long all kinds of crud builds up in our lives. Keep your life fresh and clean by taking time to internalize the Scripture!



So how about a New Year's Resolution for 2021? We will once again immerse ourselves in God's transforming Word by committing to read the

Books of Poetry as a church community for 8 weeks beginning on Monday, January 11. The reading schedule recommends about ten pages of reading for five days a week. Our weekly sermons will focus on one of the major themes covered in the previous week's readings. Also, the Rogers/Kaufman Christian Formation class will read along and discuss as a class.

The Books of Poetry are some of the most beloved and practical writings in the Bible. We often turn to the Book of Psalms for comfort, Proverbs for wisdom, Job for perspective, Ecclesiastes for purpose, Song of Songs for love and Lamentations for hope.

I would encourage every older student and adult to participate. After all, we all need to eat.

You can pick up a copy of the Immerse Bible from the church for \$10. If you are unable to commit to reading 10 pages per day, you may consider utilizing the **Family Devotional Guide** highlighting one of the key passages from each day's reading (including family devotional questions).

Finally, there is an option available for listening to the daily readings on audio. This, along with all of the other resources can be downloaded from <a href="https://covchurch.org/search-covchurch">https://covchurch.org/search-covchurch</a>. Simply type in the words: "Poets – Immerse".
