A Full, Rich, Satisfying, Abundant Life - Connor Gibson

John 10:10b:

I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. (NIV)

My purpose is to give them a rich and satisfying life. (NLT)

I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. (ESV)

Question: Are you experiencing the full, rich, satisfying, and abundant life that Christ came to give you? Is that your experience right now? Another way to look at it: Are you overflowing with the fruit of the Spirit? Ya know, those things like love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, and self-control? Or, do you feel like your walk with God is more a daily practice of repressing and ignoring the "bad" things you probably "shouldn't" do/feel/think about? (Insert your particular sin, struggle, or fear here).

I pose these questions because, sometimes, I think we tend to focus on our relationship with Jesus as some sort of business agreement, like, "I'll give you this if you give me this," rather than an all-out, all-encompassing, joy-filled, divine love affair with the God who has come to set us free! (Gal. 5:1).

If you are not experiencing the abundant life in Christ, perhaps you are pursuing the wrong "things" and not pursuing the right "who." Perhaps you've got Matthew 6:33 backwards. Here's something to ponder:

Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere. - Psalm 84:10a (NIV) My grandfather passed away many years ago. Any of you who have lost a loved one know that what I am about to



say is true. I do not miss the gifts and things that my grandfather gave me. I don't miss Christmas and birthday presents. I don't miss cards stuffed with cash, or a free lunch every now and then. What I miss is him. I miss talking to him. I miss going to the gun range with him. I miss watching football with him on the couch while the sound is muted because he couldn't stand the commentators. I would trade all the things he ever gave me for another day of just being with him. (Suddenly, Psalm 84:10 makes a little more sense...)

I think that many of us, if we're honest, often don't pursue God to experience and be with Him, but to receive the things that we want from Him. A better marriage, freedom from addictions, less anxiety, more financial security, etc... Don't get me wrong, all these are good desires. But how would you feel if your kids came to you every time they wanted something and only when they wanted something? That would not be a very healthy and life-giving relationship for either you or your child. Yet for some of us, that is how we approach our faith with God as His children.

Instead, let's pursue the greatest gift of all: God himself! Matthew 6:33 tells us that when we pursue His kingdom and righteousness, everything else will be added to us as well.

We don't need to worry or chase after things, because God supplies every need of ours according to His riches in mercy in Christ Jesus (Phil 4:19). So, in those ways we've sought after the things of God over God Himself, let's return in repentance like the story of the prodigal son (Luke 15), who initially valued the things of his father over the relationship with his father. And just like the prodigal son, God welcomes us back with open arms when we return to Him. He is a loving Father! Yes, He gives good gifts to those who ask (Matt 7:11), but...

...Let's not chase the gifts. Let's chase the Giver!

A final word. When our sole pursuit becomes Jesus Himself, He often calls us to give up the "things" we want in order to receive more of what He wants to give us. Are you trusting that His plan and desires for you are way, way, way (insert "way" 100 more times), way better for you than your plan and desires? Are you willing to listen for Jesus' voice and step out of the boat of your misplaced comfort and security to walk towards where He is at, deciding that He is better than anything else you could ever ask or imagine for yourself?

Friends, that is the path of the full, rich, satisfying, abundant life that Jesus has come to give us. Do you want to walk on water!? Listen for Jesus' voice, step out of the boat, walk towards Him, and be amazed at what He empowers you to do! He's got you.

Saying "Yes!" - Dan Kliewer

Since I retired from the refinery about 7 years ago with 32 years of service, possibly the biggest change for me has been the freedom to be available and to say, "Yes!"



When my daughter asked if I could pick up her first grader from school, I was able to say, "Yes." As soon as we met at the school, my granddaughter asked if we could go get some french fries. I said, "Yes!" So we went to DQ, got the fries and sat down at a booth. There we were, just the two of us and the chance for me to ask, "How's it going?"

It struck me that this is just what Jesus wants to do with us. He gives us all kinds of gifts, interests, desires and sometimes just what we ask for, like french fries. Revelation 3:20 says that Jesus stands at the door knocking. If we hear Him and let Him in (say, "Yes," to Him), He will be glad to come in and have french fries with us (ie: enjoy the gifts, interests and abilities He's given us as we spend time together).

Someone asked if I would like to play tennis on MWF mornings. I said, "Yes," and found an incredibly positive group full of encouragement (with plenty of competition) and striving to use their gifts and abilities for God's kingdom.

Another friend was sharing about how he was involved in jail ministry. He invited me to come give it a try. That was about five years ago and I've been stopping by the jail almost every Thursday evening to visit and pray with the guys who want to. It's amazing to see how God's love impacts their hungry hearts! God is clearly at work in their lives as they're healed from pain, bitterness, guilt and depression. He responds when they reach for His light in the midst of their potentially dark consequences and circumstances.

One Sunday as I arrived at church, I mentioned to a staff person that I was interested in mentoring someone. He said, "How about that guy?" I said, "Yes," and we've had a very good relationship for over five years. God's transformation in his life has gone way beyond anything I expected and I'm thankful for the opportunity to be a part of it!

A book idea jumped into my head (I believe God threw it in there) so I said, "Yes," and wrote, "Set Sail." It's a brief message that's had a big impact on me and others, including many of the guys at the jail. It's all about inviting Jesus into our boat as we sail to our islands of opportunity every day. A couple of the tennis players encouraged me to try Senior Golf at Turkey Creek on Thursday mornings and I said, "Yes." I've thoroughly enjoyed the camaraderie as we cheer each other on over 18 holes. It's a great chance to ask and share how it's going as we hit the little white ball as best we can.

Last fall, one of the other golfers asked me if I liked singing. I said, "Yes I do," and he invited me to join the Kansas Mennonite Men's Chorus. We started practicing in January and just completed concerts at Tabor and Bethel in April. Many of the 120 members have been in this choir for over 20 years and some for over 50 years! I was surprised at how much I enjoyed harmonizing and fellowshipping

with the other guys. Also, having those songs of praise and courage echoing in my head throughout the week has been a huge blessing. **Scan** this code to see a video of our performance at Tabor. One of my favorite songs starts at the 11-minute mark.



I see so many around me saying, "Yes," to God in all kinds of ways and having amazing experiences! I'm thankful for retirement and for Romans 8:28 that says all things work together for good for those that love Him. That verse applies even in my Crescendo years and gives me the courage to take risks by saying, "Yes," more often. Because as long as He's in my boat, I know I'll be okay! - Dan





Connecting women to each other and to Jesus!

Women's Ministry is excited to announce a couple of opportunities for you and other women at Countryside.

Once again, we are bringing back **The Gathering Table** for the months of May, June and July. Women who have participated in the past have been excited to get to know other women who attend Countryside through this experience! Groups are formulated with six women who meet for two hours once a month possibly for a meal, or in a coffee shop or restaurant, or the park, for example. A hostess will contact you suggesting times to meet and what the plans are for the first get together. If it's for a meal, she will let you know what you can bring to add to the meal. During the evening the focus of discussion will center around a Bible verse, answering a few Christ-centered questions, and then praying for one another. If you are interested but haven't signed up, please contact me soon so you can be placed in a group.

Our team believes that during this season at Countryside we are to focus on discipling and/or mentoring women. And because of that, a group of 11 women have met twice to put some direction to this emphasis. We strongly believe too that God has given us the task to "invest" in women's lives! Summer seems to be a great time to establish some guidelines and training for mentors. If you want more information about possibly serving as a mentor, I'd love to have a conversation with you. Our current goal is to be able to connect women to other women and to Jesus beginning this fall.

A new Bible study will be offered this summer at two different times ... we'll be studying the book **Restless** by Jennie Allen. In this eight-session, video-based study, we'll look at the life of Joseph and see how his passions, relationships, and suffering fit into the greater story of God – and how

our stories can do the same. We'll walk through a practical plan to identify the threads of life and how to intentionally weave them together for God's glory and purposes. Here's when these studies will be offered:

- ⇒ Tuesdays at 9:30 am, begins June 9; Childcare by reservation.
- ⇒ Thursdays at 7 pm, begins June 12; Sorry, no child care available.

Hopefully you can join us for one of these sessions. You can write "Restless" on your Connection Card on Sunday or call the Church Office to reserve a book and let us know if you will need childcare.






