

If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matt 6:25-33 NIV)

It is my earnest hope and prayer that as we continue to focus on seeking God's kingdom and righteousness, that we will exercise and experience His grace in all we do. The Leadership Team is monitoring COVID-19 issues and continues to provide support to our staff in decisions and processes for us to regroup and regather as a church.
