What Do We Display?

Republican vs. Democrat. Pretrib vs. Posttrib. Masks or No Masks, etc. etc, etc. There are so many issues that divide us today, and they are only growing. Satan is the author of dissention, disrespect, and disunity. When Jesus is present, peace, unity and respect will be evident.

I love our Covenant Affirmations. The Sixth Affirmation has to do with freedom. It can be summed up in the following way:

We are not only freed from sin and freed in order to serve; we are also free to agree to disagree on the matters that are non-essential to our salvation.

As we often repeat in our church:

"In Essentials, Unity. In Nonessentials, Freedom; In All Things, Love."

I think the most compelling characteristic of a believer in Christ is the ability to offer love and respect to those with whom we disagree. The apostle Paul addresses this distinctive of freedom in Romans 14 and 1 Corinthians 8.

"Let us stop passing judgment on one another....Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification....Do not destroy the work of God for the sake of food" – (political affiliation, end times beliefs, health practices, etc.). The Apostle Paul concluded in 1 Corinthians 8: "Therefore, if what I eat (a nonessential) causes my brother to fall

into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause him to fall."

The life lived for Christ will demonstrate strong

evidence of love and respect to one another. If these attitudes and qualities are missing in our interactions and responses, then our witness for Christ will be interpreted as a loud gong or a clanging cymbal (1 Corinthians 13:1) even when we are confident that conviction is correct. Our attitudes will only serve to push people further away from knowing Jesus.

As someone said, "We can win the battle, but lose the war."

The next time you are tempted to jump into a heated debate with someone over an issue (especially when it is nonessential to their salvation), remember that our highest priority is to display the attitude of Christ by our love and respect to him or her.




<u>Covenant World Relief</u>

LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

Well, we are in the final months of 2020 and what a year it has been. We have all seen significant changes in how we live our everyday lives. And I am sure, we have all taken some time to re-evaluate our priorities and have given thought to how we spend our time and our resources. Some of us are finding renewed focus in our relationships with our loved ones and with our God. I believe that because we have continued to seek and follow God's leading through this difficult year, He has continued to bless us in abundant ways which, in turn, have allowed us to be His blessing to our community, our conference, and the missionaries and ministries we support.

In past years, we have always encountered a time during the year where the monies we receive via our tithes and offerings fail to keep pace with our expenditures and we get into a shortfall situation. God has always been faithful to our needs and we have not had to take extraordinary actions to work through these deficit times. Because of God's blessing this year and the faithful giving of our congregation, we have not seen the typical slow times during the 2020 year. This is remarkable given the Covid pandemic and all the changes we have made to respond to this issue. Thanks for your faithful giving.

The Leadership Team has a process in place that for each month of the year where we maintain a minimum level in our cash reserve, we allocate \$3,000 to our Missions FAITH Fund and \$5,000 to our Properties FAITH Fund. We began the program several years ago after we paid off our mortgage and had the financial freedom to focus on supporting ministry activities to further the harvest in God's kingdom. During the year 2020, we have been able to allocate these FAITH funds every single month.

It has been a delight during Leadership Team Meetings that our discussions of how we use these FAITH Funds has been focused on how we, as a church, allow God's blessings to flow <u>through us</u> and not <u>to us</u>. God continues to bless us by allowing us to be His blessing to others. I would encourage all of us to continue to see ourselves as God's blessing to those around us.

During the past several months, I have been challenged to remember the words of Jesus in his model prayer – "... give us this day our daily bread...". God has promised to provide for us what we need for today. It is not about what we need tomorrow, or next week, or next month; but what we need today. In the same way we should be focusing on how we can be obedient and faithful to God today. We need not be concerned with what He asks of us tomorrow, or next week or next month, but what He does ask of us today. It is when we apply these perspectives to our daily lives, that God uses us to show the world who He is and allows us to be His light in the world's darkness.

I will put in another plug for the children's programs. Amy Brunk, our Director of Children's Ministries has done an outstanding job this year of keeping the Children's Ministry programs moving forward and aligned with keeping our congregation safe during the Covid issues. That said, we are still short on volunteers for these programs. Please pray for discernment and ask God if He's leading you to be a part of these programs.

As we slide toward the end of the year, the Finance Committee and Leadership Team are working on the proposed budget for next year. Please be looking for it in the coming weeks and be aware of our upcoming Harvest Festival, scheduled for November 22, 2020, where we will have an opportunity for review and Q&A. Hope to see you there.
