Football season is around the corner. There is nothing more exciting (for many of us) than the start of football as we gather together under the Friday night lights of a high school football stadium to cheer on our team.

Most of us are thrilled to cheer on our school team as we consume popcorn and hotdogs and watch 22 guys knock their brains out on the field.

Author John Maxwell notes that most churches bear an eerie resemblance to football games. Crowds of people sit in their seats and cheer on their ministry stars as they do battle in the fields of life.

But being in the company of God's people is not a spectator sport. According to Paul's letter to the believers in Corinth, everybody is called to participate in the ministry battles. (I Corinthians 12:12-29). God equips each of His team members without exception to get out into the ministry field and serve as His hands and feet.

As I look out into our congregation each week, I get encouraged. I see the faces of many who are making an impact for Christ's team (strengthening His church).

I see folks who....

- Mow the church lawn and care for our church facilities.
- Lead Bible studies, life groups,

discipleship groups, and step studies.



- Make and serve meals for those in crisis.
- ReUse It Center, McPherson Housing Coalition, Celebrate Recovery, Save and Share, McPherson Food Bank, Omega House, Garden Ministry.

I have also noticed common characteristics of those who are actively engaged in the ministry trenches. They are the most grateful, joyfilled, and least critical people I know.

As someone once said: "Only those who are doing nothing have time to criticize those who are doing something."

I have left many football games for various reasons:

- Discomfort due to inclement weather or tiredness.
- Boredom knowing that my presence had little to do with the final outcome.
- Discouragement because nobody seemed to listen to my advice....etc.

The same can be true in a church. We can easily become uncomfortable, tired, bored, or discouraged if our participation is only that of a spectator.

But God would remind us that He has recruited us to be a very significant member of His Team. He, as our Coach, is telling us to give our best for the success of His Church in the world.

(And, by the way, if you have ever played under a coach, you will remember that the coach's words are not suggestions).

We are expected to get out of the bleachers and onto the field.

It was an INCREDIBLE experience serving with Mission Arlington. This week grew us all so much! And what a sweet reminder that God is at work everywhere, and that is a humble experience to be empowered by the Spirit to do His work and share the gospel with joy!



"What We Assume, What We Miss"

Learning to see others through the eyes of grace, not judgment.

Each month, as I sit with the Lord and reflect on what message to share, I ask Him to open my eyes and ears to what He wants me to see. This time, the word that kept pressing on my heart was "assumptions." It started popping up everywhere—conversations, thoughts, and quiet moments of observation. And soon, I realized how much damage assumptions can do.

In our work at McPherson Housing Coalition, I see it all the time. People form opinions about those who live in our cottages. They assume these families are lazy, irresponsible, or undeserving. But they don't know the real stories.

One family came to us after losing everything in a house fire. Another is a senior whose wife is dying—he sacrificed everything to care for her. These are stories of courage, loss, and love. Yet outsiders make judgments based on what they think they see. They don't ask. They don't know. They just assume.

And if I'm being honest, I've done it too. I've looked at someone and made a silent judgment in my heart. Maybe you've done it too. The problem with assumptions is that they distance us from compassion. They harden our hearts and blind us to God's image in others.

But Jesus didn't make assumptions. He saw people *fully*. He saw the woman at the well not as an outcast but as someone worthy of truth. He saved

the thief on the cross—not because of merit, but because of grace. Was the thief "deserving"? Are we?

Scripture calls us to humility and mercy. James 2:1 warns against showing favoritism and judging others by outward appearances. And Micah 6:8 reminds us what God requires of us: "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

As I look around, I see that Oak Harbor Cottages is full. Sutherland Estates is full. The need in our community continues to grow, and still, God brings us people—His people—each with their own story and dignity. What if we began to see them as Jesus does? What if, instead of holding onto assumptions, we chose to approach others with understanding, empathy, and love?

This month on our *Housing for Good* podcast, we had the privilege of speaking with Pastor Jon Black about this very topic—faith and the Church's role in responding to housing instability. That episode aired the week of July 21st, and I encourage you to listen. His words are a powerful reminder that the Church is called not just to believe—but to act, to love, and to stand with those in need. https://mcphersonhousingcoalition.org/podcast/





LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

Our summer will soon end. Before we know it school will be in session again. This season is always too short for me. I learn more with each season and the changing seasons of life. Oh, do I ever?! Things I wish I had known or been able to let go of sooner. But God promises to bring His people new things on a continual basis.

See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. Isaiah 43:19 NIV "See or (Behold), I am doing a new thing": This phrase signifies God's ongoing work of something fresh and transformative. It's not a one-time event, but a continuous process. Just as our lives are both physical and spiritual.

Now it springs up (or forth); do you not perceive it?" Calls for attentiveness and awareness of God's activity in the present moment. It's an invitation to recognize and participate in the new thing God is doing.

"I will even make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert": This is a metaphor for God's ability to provide solutions and resources where they seem lacking. He can create paths through difficult situations (wilderness) and bring life-giving sustenance rivers in the desert.

In the context of Isaiah: This verse comes after a reminder to forget the past and it's limitations. It's a message of hope and encouragement for God's people, particularly in the midst of exile or difficult circumstances. So, this verse encourages believers to trust in God's power to bring about new beginnings, to be open to His leading, and to recognize His presence and provision in their lives. It's a verse that speaks of God's faithfulness, His sovereignty, and his ability to work in ways that surpass human understanding.

I am continually awed by the new things, new opportunities, new pathways God brings especially in the wilderness or difficult times of life. The hard part is recognizing it.

Most of all, wilderness seasons can sometimes make us forget that God has individual purposes for all of us in His eternal plan. Just as He did for the Israelites, He has a path through the wilderness you may be experiencing to reach the blessings and understanding you so desperately want.

So, we shouldn't give up hope that nothing will change in our lives. God always has something up His sleeve. And what He brings usually grows us into stronger people of faith and hope.

Trust what God has in store for you, the blessings of this temporary world before we reach the eternal blessing of heaven with Him.
