Connecting women to each other and to Jesus ... We were created for community. And because our Father is generous, He's given us one of the most

essential and life-changing relationships for community: friendship. The benefits of a relationship with other women touch on three major parts of each woman which are necessary for a woman to recognize. God's word gives support to one of those parts - the **emotional** side that we all have:

Love: Proverbs 17:17 A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity. Ask not, "Do I receive this type of friendship, but do I give this type of friendship?" Romans 12:10 Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. A great friend is ready to stand by at great personal expense.

Acceptance: Romans 15:7 Accept one another, then just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. Acceptance is not permissiveness, but responsibility with the goal of maturity.

Support: Romans 12:15 Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. *A friend walks with me through the good times and the bad times.*

Freedom of Expression: James 1:19 My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry. *Do I have a friend I can trust and share deeply with?*

Proverbs 17:9 He who covers an offense promotes love, but whoever repeats the matter separates close friends. A friend overlooks an offense; does not betray a confidence.

Another aspect that Scripture speaks to is our **physical** side.

A. Help in Work and Trouble

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work. If one falls down, his friend can help him up. But, pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up!

B. Health to Your Body

Proverbs 16:24 Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones.

Proverbs 17:22 A cheerful heart is good medicine,

but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. A discontent and a bitter heart in a friend dries up the vitality of a relationship.

The third aspect that we need to consider is, of course, our **spiritual** connection.

A. Counsel

Proverbs 27:9 Perfume and incense bring joy to the heart, and the pleasantness of one's friend springs from his earnest counsel. *Spiritual counsel from the word*.

Proverbs 27:17 As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another. A good friend stimulates and sharpens you.

B. Speaking the Truth in Love

Ephesians 4:15 Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is Christ.

Proverbs 27:6 Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses.

C. Encouragement

Hebrews 3:13 But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called Today, so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. Philippians 2:4 ... look out for the interest of others. Have an attitude of Christ.

Women need each other and let's often ask ourselves ... what kind of a friend am I?

Our ministry team members encourage relationships with other women and, therefore, we invite you to share in the opportunities that we provide for women of all ages and stages of life. Together we are planning A Pinteristing Day for you to join us on Saturday, November 16 where you can learn a new skill and connect with other women and to Jesus!

Luke 18:19b ... No one is good - except God alone.

Hebrews 10:24-25 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another.

- To notice where God is at work in my life and the


- lives of those I encounter and how to pay closer attention to His movement

Our podcast, highlighting these incredible living leaders of faith, serves as a platform that amplifies their work and inspires others to do the same, thereby changing lives and spreading our mission. LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

"I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" 2 Tim 4:7

Ministry Coordination Council (MCC)

We have about a dozen Ministry Teams (MT) which exist to implement the varied ministries of Countryside as determined by the Leadership Team (LT). Examples are the MOMs group, the properties team and the missions team. These teams can be very grassroots, our LT/MT model is flexible and responsive – it allows people to work where they are called to accomplish the mission and ministry of our church. The MT leaders are appointed by the LT, and then each MT organizes itself and recruits its own people. When we speak of the Ministry Coordination Council (MCC), that is the body of Ministry Team Leaders. They meet quarterly for coordination, encouragement and to resolve any problems. Staff and LT members may also attend the MCC meetings, either because of involvement or to encourage and to facilitate resolution of any issues. The LT Vice Chair (Reba) chairs the MCC meetings. The LT are stewards of Countryside, and LT is separate from the MCC; but the LT serves as a sounding board and advocate; a resource for the MCC. The LT serves as a liaison (both ways). We seek to have our ministries fully engaged, running the race to win!

Leadership Team (LT) monthly meeting report

- Reba reported on the September MCC quarterly meeting (see paragraph above!). I am very thankful for the faithful work of each of our ministry teams and for the leadership of each of the team leaders. I appreciate the attentiveness given in their reporting to Reba. I appreciate their discipline to be available and attend the MCC quarterly meetings. Reba is mindful to keep the meeting material / reports/sharing on track and focused, and for September she reported very validating feedback. While I missed this meeting, I know also that these meetings often spur useful side conversations of coordination between the teams.
- Classroom update: painting has been complete for a month, some carpeting remains to be installed
- FAITH Funds continue to be a blessing to us. We are extending support for the next twelve months for New Life Church in Wichita. This is being done with First Covenant, Salina and the Midwest Conference (MWC).
- Pastor Jeremy is back from Ministry Renewal. He described hearing from God in many ways, and he was convicted of "the absolute importance of spending daily

- time in God's Word (the Bible)", in particular "... the quality of time with reflection" (emphasis is mine).
- Connor is presently taking his six-week Ministry Renewal; lets keep him in our prayers. You will have noticed the worship teams are being led each week by various leaders. We can be thankful for them stepping up, and we can also be thankful for Bobbie Kaufman serving as the point person during Connor's absence. Also, I note that Keragan Gates is serving in the Production Director position I spoke of at the beginning of the year; Keragan also serves (separately) as Student Worship Director for Lizy. Connor also has noted that Sean Gates is interning with us again.
- It is the time of year that Ministry Teams will be preparing requests toward a draft budget. Expenses and receipts are generally tracking for this time of year, but perhaps that statement isn't quite fair: we have received a single large contribution this year (making a surplus) and also our sum of account balances is quite a bit higher than this time last year. As a reminder we're now allocating funding toward what is essentially self insurance on the roof, so money goes out of the budget and out of the general fund, but then goes back into the bank account in an accruing fund for future use. Thanks for your faithfulness!
