Recently we welcomed and celebrated with others when they chose to take the step of membership at Countryside Covenant Church.

Our Covenant membership materials offer five reasons for joining a local church. I will share three.

Joining a church conveys:

1. A Love for What Jesus Loves.

Joining a church is a public declaration of a spiritual truth; namely that Jesus loves His Church and is deeply committed to her (also known as the Body of Christ or the Bride of Christ).

How do you think your friend would feel if you were to inform him on his wedding day: "I love you like a brother, but I don't care much for your bride?"

I think he would feel the same way that Jesus feels when His children disregard His church.

1 John 4:21 - And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.

2. A Commitment to Other Believers

When people are asked why they go



to church, many respond by stating the many ways their church benefits their lives or the lives of their family. We need others for our spiritual growth. But others need us as well, and the unique spiritual gifts and abilities we have been given to serve them.

God gives us 39 different oneanother commands in the New Testament for good reason.

Rom 12:10 - Be devoted to one another in love.

When Lynn and I first rented an apartment, we took good care of it, but were not invested enough in it to make capital improvements. We understood that it was not our permanent residence.

When we eventually purchased a house, we committed ourselves to years of home improvements because we knew that we would remain there for years.

We became even more committed to caring for our home when the pipes busted or the sewer backed up, or the walls cracked, or weeds popped up in the yard. Why? Because we loved our home and we were invested in it.

The same can be said for church membership. We will be devoted to the specific body of believers to which we were committed.

3. A Love for the Unsaved

As believers, we are called to *go and make disciples of all nations* – Matt 28:19.

We are called to be Christ's witnesses in Jerusalem (our communities), Judea, and Samaria (those who are unlike us), and to the ends of the earth - Acts 1:8.

God sent His Son into the lost world to offer salvation to us. He now sends us to do the same as His hands and feet. We can accomplish much more together than separate.

How much would we accomplish if you were the **only person**.....

- to show up for our annual Trunk or Treat?
- to organize and offer VBS at church?
- to take care of the church building and property?
- to fund the missions and ministries of our church?

God would certainly bless you for your faithfulness as an individual. But how much more effective would we be if we were to each contribute with our gifts, talents, and resources to do the work?

I often run into people who tell me that their only church is on a podcast or television broadcast. We can certainly learn much from others' teachings. But we are called to so much more as members of Christ's Church, His body of believers. We are called to be givers. We are called to others.

The saying "April showers bring May flowers" has been around for a long time. To me, it symbolizes the harvest that

comes after hard work and perseverance. I have witnessed this unfold in many different ways. First, through the hard work of volunteers and donors who show up time after time to help with our many projects; Brush Up Mac, Oak Harbor Cottages, McPherson County Housing Conference, and so much more. Their dedication has assisted single parents and allowed seniors to stay in their homes. They have provided a safe haven which has allowed families to heal and feel loved. Finally, it gives me so much hope when I walk through the tiny homes, watch a group of students pick up leaves for a 90-year-old widow, or when state and federal agencies come to our communities and are amazed by our faith community. Following God's lead, we have brought the rain for a bountiful harvest.

Testimony: "I was lost and alone, spiritually and emotionally broken, with little hope. I had nowhere to go and no one to turn to when I found MHC and the Oak Harbor Cottages. Although I had to make some hard choices, they assured me they would not let me fall and that I could become independent, move forward, and succeed. Today, I am independent, feel loved and supported, and I thank God every day for these faithful people who care so deeply for others."



LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

March Leadership Team Meeting:

-As a follow up to my comments at the Annual Meeting, I report that Aaron Glendening in his work with FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes) will be moved from outreach to be under our Missions Team umbrella. This is not a dollar change, rather this comes after review in which our Missions Team recognizes that Aaron is committed to full time mission work just like our international partners, and like them he raises his own support and is making mission (service and outreach to others) his life's work. This is no change to our many years history of support, but this "re-listing" does make sense!

-Connor will be taking a six-week ministry renewal leave this fall, generally this will happen about when Pastor Jeremy returns from his leave. I have shared before that many of our staff have pastoral duties in their work at Countryside as shown in their "job description." Per church policy this leave is listed for pastors, but the Leadership Team discerned this is an appropriate use (this is not without precedent). Please support Connor, and other staff and praise team people as preparation is made. We are very blessed by our staff and by Connor; it is a privilege that we have resources and the ability to provide Connor with time for "spiritual, emotional and physical rest, study, prayer and vision casting." To God be the glory!

-I again affirm how blessed we are financially – thank you for your faithfulness. For a couple years now, including at present, our criteria of adequate funds on hand have meant that every month we allocate funds toward capital (think big building costs or projects) and also toward "faith funds" which we use to bless others and support unbudgeted kingdom needs or opportunities, typically outside of our church. For March we had a great discussion and as a result are intentionally entering into prayer as we consider each month how to use faith funds, and also, we will make it our practice to then pray that God will bless them for their intended purpose. During March's meeting, after spirited discussion and consideration, we were led to share some faith funds in a different way - realizing not always will people come to a building to be "churched," this distribution of faith funds goes to an intentional effort by FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes) to share Jesus by going to where area youth (and families) spend a great deal of time - ask me or another Leadership Team member and we will tell you about this!

Mission Statement

-Alan Foresman, church consultant, met with our Leadership Team in February to discuss leadership team essentials, reflect on progress, and consider forging the future. Also in February, I benefited from a Midwest Conference zoom meeting for church leadership led by Aaron Hoffman, a Marine Corps veteran, and certified Group Facilitator. Aaron overviewed the value and use of a church mission statement, vision statement and values, and among topics Alan reviewed with our LT was the need for clarity. Next article, pending other LT news, I intend to write about our vision as we penned it in 2023 – "We exist to make and deepen disciples who make Jesus their top priority, obey His commands, and teach others to do the same."

-Last month I explored creeds, the most basic of which is "Jesus is Lord." I wrap up here with our mission statement from the past several years: "We are a community growing in the grace and truth of Jesus Christ as we worship, disciple, serve and multiply." It was over a dinner conversation last week that I realized I must not take for granted this identity of our church as a community that is ... "growing in the grace and truth of Jesus Christ." Let's continue to prayerfully seek God's will, and to grow in this posture of humility and service as we serve our risen Lord Jesus Christ, as we in community "grow in the grace and truth of Jesus Christ."
