# "Carry Each Other's Burdens" Reba Becker, Chairman, Leadership Team

The school year has closed for the season and many changes and transitions await seniors who have graduated from high school, some exciting things, some scary things; things that they have never done before or on their own. Those who will be going to college, some far from home, leave parents somewhat anxious for what awaits and in prayers of both God's guidance and good decisions of their beloved children. The same goes without saying for those young people who have graduated from college or who may be joining the workforce or trades or focus of specialization.

So, we help to surround, ask, encourage and pray for those parents, those young people who we have watched and walked with to grow with Christ. We help them to carry the load, the weight has shifted beyond carrying it all ourselves; much like trying to move a piece of furniture or an appliance by ourselves. We may think in our heads we can do it, then the pain hits our back and we think otherwise and call a friend to help (which we should have done in the first place). Burdens can be brought into our lives by God's providential circumstances or as Paul says in Galatians they can be brought upon by our own transgressions, as Paul is referring to in the Gal. 6:2 passage of bringing restoration to one who is caught up in sin; restoring them gently. Christians are required to compassionately assist those who are being crushed by life's unbearable sorrows, troubles, illnesses. On the other hand, each of us is expected to handle responsibilities within our limits.

So, how do we do that, how do we fulfill the law of Christ? We do so by going to that brother or sister and gently love them with the love of Christ. Love is the keyword. Love fulfills the law of Christ.

Pastor Lynn asked me if I would be willing to share some encouragement about the Crescendo Ministry while she is recovering from her stem cell transplant. I can tell you that serving on the Crescendo ministry was very satisfying. To see and be a part of community, fellowship, learning, travel and adventure is always rewarding. Spending time together planning, praying, breaking bread and learning the wants and needs of our older generation is fulfilling, but not as fulfilling as spending time with them and even learning from their mistakes.

My time spent with this ministry taught me that this is the fastest growing generation that we currently have. Did you know that the number of people turning age 65 every day in the United States is 10,000 and the number of older adults will more than double over the next several decades and represent over 20 percent of the population by 2050? As I reflect on the work God has called us to through the McPherson Housing Coalition, I am overwhelmed with both humility and gratitude. Over the past month, our team has witnessed what it truly means to serve as the hands and feet of Christ in our community.

This season has brought new challenges—families on the brink of homelessness, children without safe beds to sleep in, and seniors choosing between rent and medication. And yet, in each story, we have seen God move.

One mother, after fleeing a dangerous situation, came to us scared and broken. With your prayers and support, we were able to place her in safe housing, wrap around her with resources, and remind her that she is not alone. Today, she is working, smiling, and dreaming again; proof that healing happens when the body of Christ shows up with compassion.

James 2:16 says, "If one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing

about their physical needs, what good is it?"

At MHC, we choose action. Because love—real, Jesus-kind-of-love—is not passive. It builds homes. It restores dignity. It listens. It shows up.

In partnership with local churches, city leaders, and volunteers like you, we've helped stabilize housing for numerous families this month. We've also continued our work on long-term planning to bring more affordable housing to McPherson County, a vision that takes more than bricks and dollars. It takes faith. And community.

Please continue to pray for the individuals we serve, our staff, and our city. Pray for wisdom, endurance, and open hearts. And if you feel led, we invite you to join us—through volunteering, donating, or simply sharing the story of what God is doing through MHC.

Let us be the light that shines in the darkness. Let us be a refuge.



# "Faith Lessons" by Ray Vander Laan

Faith Lessons is a powerful video-based Bible study series created by Bible teacher and historian Ray Vander Laan. The series, also known as That the World May Know, brings the Bible to life by exploring the historical, geographical, and cultural context of Scripture. Filmed on location in Israel, Turkey, Egypt, and other biblical sites, Vander

Laan teaches viewers how the ancient world informs and deepens understanding of the Bible's message.

Each episode features Vander Laan guiding groups through significant biblical locations, linking modern faith with ancient practices and the experiences of God's people throughout history. His teaching emphasizes how biblical truths were meant to be lived out—not just understood intellectually—and challenges believers to live boldly and faithfully in today's world.

Key themes include:

- ⇒ The importance of historical and cultural context in interpreting Scripture.
- ⇒ The faithfulness of God through trials and exile.
- ⇒ The call to discipleship and living counter-culturally.
- ⇒ Understanding the Bible as a unified, unfolding story of redemption.
