- 4. We will have shirts for those who register.


You might be asking ... "Why register? And is there a fee?" There will be registration so we can plan on food and snacks,

Crescendo Ministry offers a life rubric for people who seek God's purpose for their lives just before and during retirement years. Here are some questions to ask yourself if you're hoping to be a well-rounded retired person:

Spiritually – What do I do daily, weekly, monthly that encourages my walk with Christ? Am I open to the Holy Spirit's leading and do I understand how to hear His voice? What younger people am I in relationship with that I pass along my Godly wisdom to?

Physically – Am I paying attention to my health by staying active, eating good food, and getting regular rest and Sabbath days? How well am I financially prepared for my future? What resources can I tap for help in this area?

Intellectually - Am I challenging my mind by learning new things each day? Do I read regularly? How old do I perceive myself to be in my mind?

Community - Who do I regularly get together with? Am I seeking the company of those both older and younger than myself? How do I stay in communication with my family members in a meaningful way?

Emotional Health - Am I lonely? How can I get more involved in my church, neighborhood, and community? Do I need help getting over personal regret or anger?

Service - Do I understand that service is not an option for the Christian? What needs do I see around me that God might want me to help meet? What is my God-given purpose in the season I am currently living?

A Day in the Life of A Case Manager: God's Light in the Darkness

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." – Psalm 46:1

Every morning, Tammy, McPherson Housing Coalition's case manager, kneels in quiet prayer: "Lord, give me strength. Let me be Your hands and heart today, especially for those who feel forgotten."

Her work begins before she even sits at her desk. She has just helped John, a veteran recently honorably discharged, who found a job immediately but had nowhere to live with his family, move into a safe home after weeks of fear and uncertainty—when the phone rings again. On the line is Martha, a senior, voice trembling with tears, explaining that Social Security is not enough to cover rent or food. Tammy listens, prays quietly, and moves quickly to find a solution, knowing that for some, the night ahead could be the difference between shelter and hardship.

The stories pile up. Rachel, a single mother who had lived in fear for years, finally finds the courage to call for help. With Tammy's support, she secures a home and a job—a place where her children can finally laugh without worry. A family had been living in a trailer so overrun with mice it was unsafe for their children. Tammy acted quickly, moving them

into Oak Harbor Cottages. Even temporarily, it became a sanctuary from the chaos and danger they had endured.

And there are moments that pierce the heart. Kathy, a mother newly moved into the cottages, stood silently by her bed, tears streaking her face. When Tammy gently asked why, she whispered, "This is the first bed I've ever had of my own." That bed, small and ordinary, is the first safe night she has ever known. That bed is hope.

Through every phone call, every emergency, every setback, Tammy holds onto Galatians 6:9: "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

By helping families in need, you answer God's call in Proverbs 31:8-9: "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves... defend the rights of the poor and needy." Your care gives a mother peace, a child safety, a senior dignity—and together, we bring God's light into lives overshadowed by fear and struggle.

Every key handed over, every meal shared, every moment of care is a heartbeat of hope. Together, we turn despair into safety, homes into havens, and strangers into family.

LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

It seems like the world is getting crazier as the days go by. The best promise we, as Christians, can hold on to is in John 16:33 "I have told you this so that you will have peace by being united to me. The world will make you suffer. But be brave! I have defeated the world!" (Good News Translation)

Over the past few months, many Christian leaders have gone on to be with Jesus in Heaven, one of the latest being Voddie Baucham. He delivered a message that stated, "You will hear a rumor one day that Voddie Baucham is no more. Don't you believe it! Because though I die, I will rise with Christ. It will not be the end of me, because Christ is raised, and I, too, will be raised with Christ. Do not pity me." What a mindset to have, that though I am no longer on earth, I am more alive than ever!

Mindset and focus have been the topic of chapels I have been giving to the college teams I get to serve. It is not lost on me that this is something not only college athletes deal with, but we all do. No matter our age, gender, ethnicity, vocation, etc. the world around us is shaping us one way or another. I have challenged these athletes, and I challenge you to take every thought captive, to fix your eyes on Jesus by having a renewed thinking. As Paul stated in Romans 12, "Do not be *conformed* to this world, but be *transformed* by the renewing of your mind." (NIV, italics added)

How do we renew our minds?

- Immerse yourself in Scripture. The Bible isn't just information: It's transformation. It reorders your perspective and aligns you with truth.
- Meditate on God's Word. Think deeply about it. Turn it over in your mind. Let it sink in
- **Speak truth out loud.** Declare Scripture over your life. Hearing truth strengthens faith.

- Capture rogue thoughts. When a thought doesn't align with God's truth, take it captive and confront it. Don't let it run loose.
- **Pray for transformation.** Ask God to help you see situations, people, and yourself as He does.

Let us renew our minds as Christ works in and through us and we are able to "test and approve what God's will is – His good, pleasing, and perfect will" for Countryside moving forward.
