THE PULSE OF COUNTRYSIDE

The Art of One-Anothering - Pastor Jon Black

You have no doubt heard that there are 59 “one-another” commands in the New Testament. I, as your pastor, have studied and mastered these “one-another” ideas.... in the privacy of my own quiet time and space with God.

But as soon as my feet hit the pavement for the day...as soon as my cell phone begins to ring...as soon as I open up my text messages and emails.... as soon as I get tapped on the shoulder at the coffee shop....these “one-another” commands can become a distant memory.

We have spent the summer weeks exploring theological concepts in our sermon series entitled: *“The Big Picture: Our Core Beliefs.”*

Beginning this month, we will continue along this same path by considering our practical theology; namely the specific ways our theological core beliefs play out in our everyday relationships with family members, friends, co-workers, church members, and unbelievers. We will do so by unpacking some of these 59 “one-another” passages from God’s Word.

The typical outline of the New Testament letters opens with ad-

ressing theological truths such as: who we are in Christ and what we believe. The letters then conclude with how these truths play out in our daily living.



The authors of these letters, namely Paul and Peter, conclude by transitioning with phrases like: *“Therefore....”* (Rom 12:1, 1 Peter 4:1, 2 Cor 7:1); or a *“So I tell you this...”* (Eph 4:17, Gal 5:16); or a *“Since then....”* (Col 3:1).

They often utilize the “one-another” phrase that Jesus gave them in the Upper Room before His crucifixion.

*“A new command I give you: Love **one another**. As I have loved you, so you must love **one another**. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love **one another**.”* (John 13:34)

Consider Colossians 3:12–17 (which includes three “one-another” commands). Paul can’t stop talking about Jesus; (His character, His words, His actions), and how we, as the Body of Christ, are to continue to reflect Christ in everything we think, say, and do.

In the words of Scott Hubbard...

"The 'one-anothers', then, are earthly dramas of heavenly realities; they are the love of Christ played out on ten thousand stages."

So, as we hold each other accountable to more fully reflect Jesus through practical obedience to the "one-another" commands (after leaving our quiet times with Jesus), may we begin to see and hear more joy-filled testimonies of how God is able to use us to reflect His life in our daily encounters with "one-another."

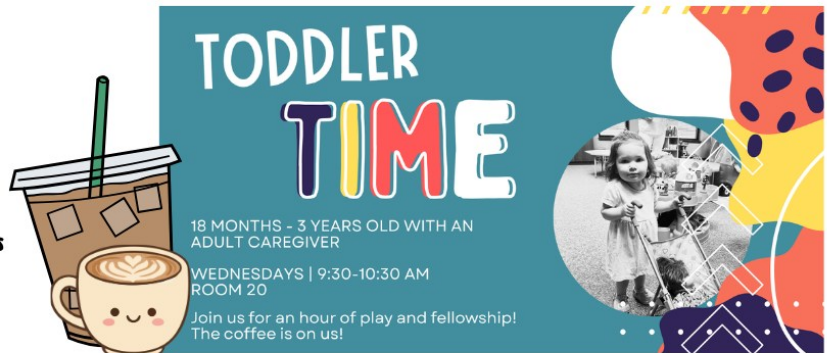
MINISTRY FAIR | AUGUST 26

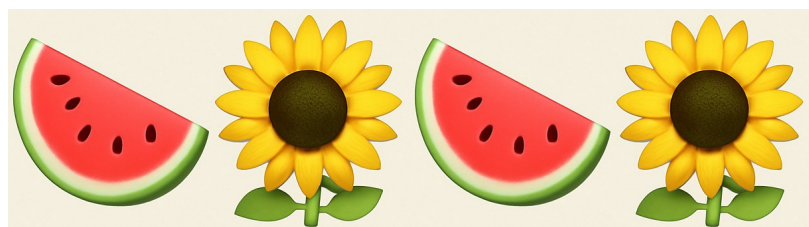
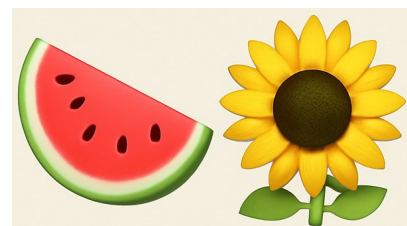

Covenant Cedars Bible Camp is the **most favorite** location in the entire world for some of our middle school and high school students! This summer proved to be no different!

LSM sent 14 middle school and 11 high school students to camp this July! Shout out to our incredible camp counselors who gave up a week of their lives to invest 24-7 in our students!



Mission Arlington 2026 was one for the books! LSM took 21 students and 8 adults to work with an organization called Mission Arlington in Arlington, Tx. While on this 6-day trip, our students had full days! They led 2 VBS events per day, consisting of games, skits, dancing, singing, crafts and sharing the gospel! They attended 2 worship services a day, prayed with and for each other, shared all meals together and spent endless hours in temperatures as high as 115 degrees! The Lord was so faithful and provided everything we needed for this trip! God is at work in pretty amazing ways.



Fall 2026 Adult Studies

A year ago I was in isolation recovering from a stem cell transplant. My world was very small and my connection to the body of Christ came in the form of cards, texts, phone calls, and quick visits at my front door. God sustained me for that season, but all along I felt very keenly that Christ followers are meant to be in deep community with one another on a very regular basis.

We are all in the process of being discipled by somebody or something. The question is, “Who?” Are you being transformed and shaped by the Holy Spirit of Christ and His people, or by the world’s standards and practices as you busy yourself with other priorities? What daily and weekly habits do you have that incorporate time spent with His people, His body, The Church? Not a team or a club or an organization or a workplace, but the people of God that He chooses for you to walk alongside at Countryside.

Who will you choose to intentionally create community with this season? Groups begin in September so register this month through the church app, website, your Sunday connection card, or by calling the church office 620-241-4499. Registration helps us know how many materials to order for each class, study, and group.

Adult Christian Formation Classes begin Sept. 13

(Sunday mornings at 9:45am between services; coincides with children’s CF classes and nursery care.)

Marriage: Loving and Laughing with the Lord-

Whether you’ve been married for six months or sixty years, taking time to learn and laugh together goes a long way in keeping your relationship strong. Enjoy various video presenters and discussion on marriage topics including conflict resolution, his/her needs, communication, and commitment to God and each other. No homework required unless you want to start a weekly date night! (Goldsmith, Harper, Neufeldt, Vetter).

Parents of Students –The unique challenges of raising teens today call for support, encouragement, and prayer. Teen culture has its own language, rhythm, and players. Navigation w/your teen through it all requires discernment with a Biblical worldview in mind. Forge partnerships with other parents of stu-

dents and Countryside’s student ministry team as you discuss current issues concerning students in today’s world, such as social media, sexual integrity, mental health and conflict resolution. Seek God’s heart together and reclaim your peace in parenting. (Johnson and Stevenson, plus)

Practicing the Way – Walking with Jesus is not about imitation; it’s about inhabitation. Wanting deeper fellowship with Jesus? Hoping for a change? Take time to be with Jesus, become like Him, and by His Holy Spirit be empowered to do as He did. Put yourself in a position to hear from the Lord in fresh ways through familiar and ancient Biblical and spiritual practices, both in class together and at home on your own. We’ll draw on John Mark Comer’s video material, Richard Foster’s classic, “Celebration of Discipline,” and other resources to enrich your time with the Lord. (Pastors L. Black and Bower)

Journey through the Word: A Bible Reading Course

- A new three-year journey through the entire Bible! Explore how we got the Bible as it looks today. Discover how ancient manuscripts were written, how the books of the canon were chosen, and how Scripture was preserved and translated into modern English. Then read large portions of the text each week and discuss thoughts, questions, and insights as a class. Expand your understanding of the Bible as a whole and challenge yourself to consider varied interpretations of the text. (Kaufman and Rogers)

Women in the Word - Join other women in a three-and-a-half-year journey through the chronological Bible. We are currently in Genesis! Read about a chapter a day on your own throughout the week, answer a few key questions, and come prepared to share what you’ve gleaned. Fall in love with the scriptures all over again! (Anderson)

Next Step – Newer to Countryside? Need a refresher on Countryside’s beliefs and practices as an Evangelical Covenant Church? Want to get better acquainted with the staff? This 5-week course will cover topics ranging from “What is church?” to “What does the Covenant affirm?” to “How can I get involved and connected here at Countryside?” Starts Oct. 11. Reservation needed; call the church office or talk with Pastor Lynn Black. Prerequisite for leadership and membership.

Bible Studies (Various days and times)

Men's Study:

- ⇒ **Bible Study on the Book of Acts** – Enjoy great discussion over the scriptures lead by a knowledgeable team of seasoned teachers (Sents, Spencer, Stinemetze, Williford). Walk in the footsteps of those who first became The Church. Connect and grow with us! **Wednesday evenings starting Sept. 10 at 6:30pm, Room 15.**

Women's Studies:

- ⇒ **Precepts Inductive Method** – Learn for yourself how to study the Bible as you study it! Learn how to observe the text, find Biblical principles, and apply them to your life. Grow in discernment as to what God is saying to you through His living word today. Then as a class, come to discern together in community the voice of the Lord for confirmation, clarity, and dynamic discussion!

* **Thursday mornings 9:00-11:00am, starts Sept. 10, 1&2 Corinthians: How to Be or Not to Be the Church (Black, Logback). Child care upon request.**

- ⇒ **None Like Him ... 10 Ways God Is Different from Us** – Our limitations are by design. We were never meant to be God. But at the root of every sin is our rebellious desire to possess attributes that belong to God alone. Calling us to embrace our limits as a means of glorifying God's limitless power, author Jen Wilkin invites us to celebrate the freedom that comes when we rest in letting God be God. **Thursday evenings through the month of August in Room 13 at 7 pm. (Skar, Totman)**

- ⇒ **James, the Steadfast Life ...** Pursuing joy in suffering. Displaying good works by faith. Seeking wisdom in truth. These are all things that we desire to do as believers. The book of James shows us how we can submit ourselves to God and live in such a way that displays the grace given to us through Christ. This 7-week study will help equip us to 1) unpack the practical theology throughout James verse by verse, 2) apply the gospel to trials, temptations, and other areas of everyday life, and 3) be "doers" of the Word and live a life of true faith through the power of

the Holy Spirit. **Thursday evenings at 7 pm in Room 13 beginning September 10. (Skar, Totman)**

Co-ed Study:

- ⇒ **Freedom in Christ Course** – Feeling stuck? In need of refreshment in your walk with Christ? Tired of carrying the weight of past hurts, guilt, or repeating sin patterns? Step into the abundant life God has for you by learning who you really are in Christ. Walk free from shame and guilt into truth and forgiveness. Experience the freedom you didn't know you were missing! This 11-week long, video-based discipleship course (plus a half-day retreat) is designed to help every Christian break free from what is holding them back so they can become who they are made to be in Christ. LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

"One Another," the vibrancy of the body of Christ starts at the individual level and this was the theme of the recent "Gather 2026" meeting of the Evangelical Covenant Church. The need we have to engage each other in a personal way to fellowship, love, encourage and challenge each other to make the whole church more alive was emphasized throughout the event. This concept is exactly what our local leadership is pursuing as we emphasize discipleship. How do we grow our faith from a transactional experience to that more fully embracing and pursuing "Christ likeness?"

The day before the actual meetings started was devoted to training geared towards Leadership Team members. The training was actually better than I expected and covered a wide variety of topics from strictly business issues to relational aspects of church life. A big take away that applies to every group we may belong to dealt with conflict. The take away was that conflict is inevitable and is something we can embrace instead of fearing. Embrace by realizing that through disagreeing and respectfully discussing we begin to discern truth. I am reminded of the early church reformer John Calvin who taught that truth is found in the tension between false extremes. That truth may not be exactly in the middle but is found as we begin to extract truth from each of those false extremes.

Our mission here at Countryside is "We are a community growing in grace and truth of Jesus Christ as we worship, disciple, serve and multiply." Grace and truth immediately brings up conflict; how do we discern that balance? We begin by recognizing that what unites us is greater than what divides us. We share a love for Christ. Once we get beyond that, things start to get harder to always agree on. Still, if we share a common goal, engage in regular and appropriate communication, respect the roles of our leaders and seek to discern together, we can grow in our understanding of God's will for our church and experience His peace in the process. Another encouraging aspect of the "Gather" event was the diversity of ethnicity, gender and age of those present. We truly seem

to be a church seeking to engage "all nations." It is a blessing to know our denomination supports 72 missionaries, (14 here at Countryside), and have a presence in 52 countries. Another blessing was to see 52 pastors ordained or transferred into the Covenant. In addition, we have numerous efforts underway within our denomination to build disciples and engage people where they are.

Perhaps the greatest role we play is to be a "peacemaker" whenever we can as described in Matthew 5:9 *"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God."* Scripture also offers a great guide for that as we demonstrate "fruits of the spirit." Galatians 5:22-23 *"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law."*

I am thankful our church provides us opportunities and encouragement to grow, serve and share. I hope and pray you pursue those as well!
