# **Transformed**

"Sticks and stones can break my bones, but words will never hurt me."

I remember learning this small rhyme as a child and occasionally blurting it out in response to others' insults. Then one day, I remember thinking, this rhyme cannot be true. Sometimes words can hurt deeply .... which can lead to unhealthy thoughts and attitudes for years. There came a time when I realized that I needed to be set free from painful memories of past insults.

Words are powerful and can be used to build up or destroy. Satan's primary weapon is his tongue. Satan, the Father of lies and the Accuser of believers uses his tongue to deceive us, tempt us, and accuse us. In fact, the name Satan means Accuser. He understands that if he can convince people to believe his lies, then he maintains some form of control over our lives.

We must be cognizant of Satan's strategy he uses against God's children. Our battle with this accuser is not a **power-encounter**, (as Jesus has already settled that battle on the cross); it is a **truth-encounter**. Jesus taught that when we know the truth, the truth will set us free - the truth being God's Word.

When we fill ourselves with God's Word, we will think differently. Our new thoughts will lead to new ac-

tions. Our new actions will develop new habits. And our new habits will result in new character. We will experience change.

Think of the wagon trails during the days of the wild west. Over time, the trails became entrenched with deep ruts from wagon wheels. Before coming to Christ, we spent years forging deep ruts of sinful thoughts, habits and patterns of living in our brains.

When we accepted Christ, these deep ruts did not automatically disappear. They would need to be replaced with new paths...(new thoughts, new acts, new habits). Replacing the enemy's lies with the truth of God's Word is the process for our spiritual transformation.

> **Rom 12:2** - Do not conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.

This spiritual transformation can at times seem like a painfully slow process. But just as a seedling will eventually develop into a fully grown tree when it receives its proper nutrients, so we will develop to spiritual maturity when we spend time in God's Word.

Then the truth will set us free from all of those painful lies we had once believed about ourselves.



How can we be writing articles for the June issue of The Pulse? It doesn't seem possible but when I realize that we've celebrated several holidays already and that school is out, I guess it's very possible. Women Ministries at Countryside has had a fairly busy year so far and we continue to pray and plan about upcoming events as well.

Our Thursday night Bible study continues to draw 25-28 women each week. It has been a gentle reminder that Jesus extends to each of us the same invitation He gave Mary and Martha – come to me. Even though their story is somewhat familiar, we've discovered that we each have a part of Mary and a part of Martha in our lives. And we are learning to deepen our devotion to God and to delight in sitting at His feet.



### Living Missionally (part 3 of a 10 part series)

Ever watch old James Bond movies? My favorite part is after he listens to the instructional tape, it goes up in smoke. I always think to myself: how does he remember everything he heard??



As Christ followers we desire to live ALL our days "on mission." According to au-



"Your mission, should you choose to accept it..." tells us we have options when it comes to living out our mission. In Henry Cloud's book, *Boundaries*, he poses a system for deciding what you're called to do that can forever change the way you make decisions.

Throughout *Boundaries*, Cloud works to empower the reader to value the "yes" and "no" they have in their heart. He writes, "Those who can't respect our boundaries are telling us that they don't love our no's. They only love our yeses, our compliance. 'I only like it when you do what I want."

God is not asking you to meet every need you see, or every request made of you. He values the yes that's in your heart. And he's not asking you to say "yes" with your mouth when there is a "no" in your heart.

Psalm 37:4 says, "Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart." I think that not only means that he will satisfy your desires, but actually fill you with the right desires.

So if there's a yes in your heart to love someone, to do something, go for it! If there's a "no," then you either need to invite God to change your heart and pay attention to the work he does. Or you need to say "no," no matter how much someone else wants you to say "yes." Jim Denison, *Denison Forum*.


### Spiritual Growth and Renewal

If you enjoy reading, you should "check-out" our church library! We have lots of good books just waiting to be read!

The Shannon Saga by Tracie Peterson and James Scott Bell consists of three books. In book one, "City of Angels", the courtrooms of 1903 Los Angeles are a man's worlduntil Kit Shannon arrives. With shoulders squared and dreams set high, Kit arrives in Los Angeles feeling a special calling to the law. Yet under the

care of her socialite aunt, Kit quickly comes to realize that few understand her burning desire to seek justice and practice a profession known only to men. In book two, "Angels Flight", with her first trial a dramatic success, Kit Shannon steps out from the protective and guiding hand of her mentor and begins her own law practice. When she is drawn to the defense of a man

accused of a crime that crosses racial lines, Kit is unprepared for the prejudice and hatred that is hurled in her direction. A loyal supporter of the law, Kit struggles with the secret role of the very officers who claim

to represent justice. In book three, "Angel of Mercy", when an old enemy of Kit Shannon is arrested on suspicion of murder, he insists Kit is the only one who can represent him. Refusing at first, but moved by his desperation, she agrees. His possible guilt tests Kit's

resolve to represent only the innocent. Step-by-step, she discovers there is more to this case than meets the eye. Much more.

- Serving in and to our community


