The Words We Speak

When I think of the Apostle Paul, I have typically thought of a leader that was passionate, convicted, strong, risk-taker, outspoken and confrontational; as one who would never back down from a good argument. I have often thought of Paul as a consummate Alpha male with whom I would not dare to disagree or debate. I would get schooled.

But as I read through Paul's letter to the Ephesian believers this past week, I was struck with new insights into his leadership strategy and character.... namely how often he demonstrated kindness, gentleness, and patience in dealing with others.

The words we speak (or write) spill out from what is inside. Our words and attitude reveal our true heart's condition.

Consider some of Paul's words in his letter and hear what spills out from his heart.

> **Eph 4:2** - Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. 3 Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Does this mean we should never confront others with the hard truth? No. But when we speak the truth, our motive should be out of love for the other.

Eph 4:15 - Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.

What does it look like when we speak the truth in love? Paul continues:

Eph 4:29 - Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen...31 Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. 32 Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

And in all of our conversation...

Eph 5:17 -.....be filled with the Spirit, 19 speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit.

There is much to debate and confront these days. There are many reasons to be frustrated. In all our conversations....

- What do our words reveal about our heart condition?
- What are our true motives for speaking forth the truth?
- What kind of attitude is displayed in the tone of our voice and nonverbal signs?





As we turn the page on the calendar to October, I have to admit that this is my most favorite time of the year! I love football games, crunchy leaves, sweaters and sweatshirts, bonfires, candy corn with m&m's and peanuts and almost anything pumpkin! But even more than all of those things, it is the opportunity to encourage women to grow in their faith as they plug into Bible studies or attend special events and participate in service projects that Women Ministries organize.

If you haven't joined a **Bible study**, there's another opportunity for you to do so. The Thursday group will begin a new study on October 28 at



7 pm and we are looking forward to using the READ Method for our time in the Word and together. More than just a worksheet, READ will lead you step-bystep through your study of God's Word in less than 20 minutes a day. Join with other women as we transform our quiet time by learning how to **RECORD, EX-PLORE, APPLY, and DO**. The READ Bible Study Method will give you confidence each time you study God's Word. Slowing down to spend dedicated time on one passage allows the Holy Spirit to speak and provides time to digest God's Word.

- You'll discover how scripture supports scripture by examining similar and connecting Bible passages.
- You'll learn how to dig deeper into scripture to uncover historical and cultural context that will shed new light and understanding on the verses you've read.
- You'll recognize the promptings of the Holy Spirit to be a doer of the Word and not just a hearer only as James 1:22 instructs.

Watch for details as soon we will announce which book of the Bible we will be studying.

Greetings Church!

What an awesome God we serve! He never fails us nor forsakes us. Even as we have opportunity to walk through difficult times in our lives, He is always beside us; even when we may not feel His presence. Many times, it is the difficult issues that bring us closer to God. Those times when we lean hard into His love. mercy and grace while seeking His comfort and peace. And we have seen firsthand, His comfort and care among those in our church who have experienced hardship or have had loved ones called home.

When God brought His chosen people out of Egypt, He led them in the desert. How many times have we referred to their 40 years in the desert as "wandering"? And yet, they were following where God led them. He led them into difficult situations for the purpose of training them and allowing them to put into action their commitment to Him. God brought them to a position of being completely and solely dependent upon Him.

How often do we find ourselves being completely and solely dependent upon God? And when we do, what does it look like? In the eyes of the world, it may look like foolishness. In many ways it will be counter cultural. Afterall, aren't we bombarded with the concept that we must be self-sufficient? We must take care of "Number One"? No one's going to look out for us so we must look out for ourselves?

That's not the training that God was giving to His chosen people while leading them in the desert. He was teaching them to be a community, to live with the perspective that the needs of others are as important as our own needs. And to live in such a way (counter culturally) that the world would see God through the lives of this chosen people. They were to be God's message to the world. That's us. We are His chosen.

The Leadership Team takes seriously the charge of demonstrating to our community what God's love looks like in action. As a congregation, you have been faithful in your service and giving. Through that, God continues to allow us to be His blessing to others. Through our FAITH Funds, we have been able to be God's blessing in some very tangible (and countercultural) ways, helping individuals, families, and other churches in our community. Most recently, we allocated funding to the Oak Harbor Cottages project. We are looking forward to great things happening because of this project. Things that will bring glory to God as we demonstrate His sense of community.

I want to express my personal thanks for your continued support to the work God is doing at Countryside. That support comes not only in the tithes and offerings, but in your involvement in the ministry activities of the church and furthering God's kingdom in our community.
