Leadership Team Update - Mark Wurm, Church Chair

Merry Christmas!

I am most appreciative of our Leadership Team. In some areas we continue to learn and understand our duties, no doubt in some areas we are a bit behind but, we aspire to be timely for matters at hand. Sometimes new insights are shared. We regularly have voices that bring us back on track and point a way forward in obedience to God. Neither for us nor for staff do things always go as we plan, but we're realizing that's ok – I cherish this grace we extend to one another, and the encouragement to seek God's will which is our focus. Proverbs 3: 5 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

At the last LT meeting Stan Neufeld shared about Properties Team projects, especially future projects that are long range in nature. Reba and I had attended a Midwest Conference zoom meeting last August focused on church finances. Sometimes we think our building is perhaps like our car: we wonder is it too showy, perhaps it would be good or pious to rather neglect it to demonstrate that our heart isn't worldly. But in that zoom meeting, as regards our church budget, it was asked if there was such a thing as a "non ministry" expense. Indeed, it was characterized that our facilities are tools for ministry. We encouraged Stan to continue long term planning with financial projections (these won't apply to this year's budget, but this reveals our ever evolving mindset for future budgeting).

December 8 we will be holding our annual meeting to make budget approval. I share further information from that August zoom meeting that I just mentioned. I do not view these as rules, but these can be considerations as we approve our budget. Percentages a church may expect to spend in their budget were presented as follows: payroll 50-60%, missions 10-20%, church programs 5-10%, facilities/mortgage 20-25%, and IT /technology 5-10%. We are blessed to have no mortgage, but for churches having a mortgage with National Covenant Properties, NCP seeks that the church have a cash balance on hand of 2-4 months of payroll and mortgage. An expectation regarding church tithe is 3.5% of church budget to the conference and 6.5% go to the denomination (10% total). A remark made was that "money is never the heart of the matter but it is always a matter of the heart!" Also, Paul's writing in 2 Cor 8: 18-21 was referenced, verse 21 is "for we aim at what is honorable not only in the Lord's sight but also in the sight of man." Accordingly, our LT has formally adopted church policies for handling of monies received and for handling of monies disbursed.



I perhaps have shared this before, but it has now been four years since my Dad passed and I remain increasingly grateful for good memories both of what he taught me and for the way he lived as an example to me of how to live abiding in God's love. My dad gave me a beautiful picture of peace, comfort, and wonder or awe in telling me how every year when he would hear the Christmas story at their Lutheran Church in Oberlin it gave him complete peace. The reason was that the end of day milking was his daily personal time with his dad (grandpa). He and grandpa would share the days accomplishments, joys, goals, struggles, and ponder questions about life. Dad further explained that this was a warm and secure time - the inside of the barn was a safe, warm, inviting and cozy place with fresh smell of hay and the satisfied animals about. I see there is something in us that recognizes and is attracted to life, to creation that God has given us. Dad's picture is meaningful to me - while I never shared the routine daily experience, I fondly remember the barn. Dad said as he grew up this is how he imagined the peacefulness and beauty of Jesus being born in the manger – to my dad the birth of Jesus, Immanuel, God with us, seemed among the most beautiful of all passages in the Bible. I wish you all peace and joy this Christmas!



In 2011, a new community operated ministry was envisioned to make construction materials reusable that had been going to the landfill available to the public at a much reduced


price. The proceeds are shared by non-profit organizations within the county. Thus the ReUse It Center was begun.
